


Continued ongoing partnership with Georgia Works for weekly clean-ups and landscaping improvements.








Ensured the Little 5 Mobility Study was adopted by the City of Atlanta and incorporated into the Comprehensive Development Plan.


Advocated for the \$3M Euclid Avenue transformation to be on the City's final TSPLOST project list and ensured the project will be included in the first round.






Installed a new security camera in the Seminole turnaround in partnership with Atlanta Police Foundation.






Executed an updated Cooperative Agreement between the City and the CID to allow for project management of construction.
